

MARSHFIELD MADE NEW

In the heart of Wisconsin is a vibrant city just waiting for you to unplug and visit. Located in Central Wisconsin, Marshfield is well known, not only for its world-class health system, but for its rich history and welcoming community. Yet this only scratches the surface of what Marshfield has to offer visitors and locals alike!

Marshfield's roots date to the construction of a railway from Stevens Point to Lake Superior in 1872 when settlers choose the location as ideal for a supply depot. In time brothers Charles and William Upham came to the area to build a sawmill and led to the brothers expanding into additional industries of the area which preceded rapid growth in the railway town. Becoming the center of several train routes and industries, Marshfield came to be known as Hub City.

Fifteen years after the first settling of the area in 1887, a fire ignited by the sparks from a switch engine in the sawmill decimated a large swath of the city. The community rallied and rebuilt, this time using brick to avoid the possibility of another fire being able to spread so easily and quickly. Those same brick storefronts line today's downtown shopping district where one can find a delightful variety of shops to explore including a bakery, record store, used bookstore, coffee shops, boutiques, antiques, restaurants, and even a guitar store in a beautifully renovated historic building!

Another deeply intertwined aspect of Marshfield's history is healthcare starting with St. Joseph's Hospital in 1890 beginning with only six beds and the Marshfield Clinic formed in 1916 by six doctors. For over a century, Marshfield Clinic Health System has provided quality care through innovation to rural communities and continues to strive towards creating healthy communities through accessible, affordable, and compassionate health care.

Explore the rich history of Marshfield through the Marshfield Historic District Walking Tour, by touring local museums such as the Upham Mansion and the Marshfield Heritage Museum. Visit local favorite destinations that celebrate the past while building towards an exciting future including the Wildwood Park & Zoo and the Marshfield Towne Center.



The Marshfield Towne Center has gone through many changes since it opened in 1979 as Northway Mall including a stint as Shoppes At Wood Ridge and enjoyed being known as "Your Place to Meet, Eat, and Shop in Marshfield!" In 2018 Marshfield Mall saw new management changes with plans of proposed layout changes that would assist in steering the mall into the future of retail. A few years later saw City Council approval to redevelop the existing structure with larger retail spaces that would have their own outdoor entrances as well as space for smaller interior shops.

This revitalization of the mall, now becoming the Marshfield Towne Center, includes exciting new stores Harbor Freight, Five Below and Ross Dress for Less. Don't forget the reestablished favorites World Buffet and Sports Scene and a new Hobby Lobby is currently under construction with opening planned for early 2024.

The Mar shfield Towne Center is not the only area of Marshfield experiencing exciting business growth! Throughout the city visitors and locals can enjoy indoor fun at The Clubhaus golf simulator and sports bar or at The Grey Dog Axe Throwing that also features arcade games, darts, and pool. Enjoy an evening of live music at Hop & Grape while sampling a variety of beers and wines from local wineries to far flung breweries. Check out the new Dragon's Roost LLC or Oddities, Manga, and Games for die hard or casual hobby gamers. Family and children are able to enjoy a welcoming atmosphere to hang out and explore skill-building games. All of these exciting new businesses opened in 2023 and there is more in store for 2024 so be sure to visit Marshfield!



JURUSTIC PARK

Close to the center of Wisconsin is one of the most unique roadside attractions that is well worth a visit. Using reclaimed scrap metal to weld quirky creatures, creator Clyde Wynia has filled Jurustic Park with wonder and whimsy.

The park is nestled next to the McMillan Marsh Wildlife Area just north of Marshfield, and walking through the sculpture park in any season will leave visitors with a sense of wonder. As visitors wander the winding paths they will encounter a variety of creatures ranging from small critters resembling bugs, frogs, or cats to enormous breathtaking beasts that bring to mind dragons or dinosaurs to various imaginative creations that defy description - you just have to see it!

Many of the sculptures feature humorous informational cards, but the real joy is a tour led by the clever creator himself. As Clyde will have visitors believe, he is an amateur paleontologist excavating the remains of extinct creatures that inhabited the local marsh during the Iron Age. He narrates his tours with wry humor that will earn a smile from kids of all ages and truly brings the park to life.



The park is usually open most of the spring, summer, and fall from 10am-4:30pm. There is no admission charge to the public, but a fee is charged for guided group tours. Group tours are available by appointment. When visiting, be sure to wear comfortable shoes for walking and bring a camera to capture the enchanting moments.

Before leaving, visitors will want to be sure to stop into the Hobbit House where Clyde's wife, Nancy, creates and sells beautiful hand-blown glass jewelry. And if that isn't enough, more of Clyde's creations can be found throughout nearby Marshfield due to years of donations to local organizations and businesses. Check out the Downtown Jurustic Trail for an easy walk in the heart of Marshfield filled with more fun!

Jurustic Park is a hidden gem filled with the spectacular. Clyde Wynia's remarkable metal sculptures transport visitors to another world of imagination and joy. Whether you're an art lover or a nature seeker, Jurustic Park promises an unforgettable experience that will leave you with an appreciation for the creative spirit of one man's vision.

Ride On Marshfield Community Bikeshare

The Marshfield Community Bikeshare has been reimagined with help from Wood County and many partners. Starting out as a free bike check out program at local hotels, it has expanded to four community locations featuring 20 cruiser-style bikes that can be checked out via app for a rate of \$1/hour at four different locations throughout Marshfield (make sure to bring your helmet!).

This new expansion was modeled after the River Riders Bike Share program, which originally began in Wisconsin Rapids in 2014. It was created with the goal to bring additional transportation and recreation options to all of Wood County. Thanks to local community support and sponsors, this program continues to achieve that goal by growing into the city of Marshfield.

Bikes Available at These 4 Locations:

- Wildwood Park & Zoo
- Everett Roehl Marshfield Public Library
- Marshfield Clinic Health System YMCA
- Marshfield Skatepark

*The program is seasonal, and the locations can and do change based on demand

How to Use The Bikeshare:

The bike share program is an app-based program. Start by downloading the Koloni App (available on Android and Apple stores). It is free to download and sign-up. Create your own user account by following in-app instructions.

Once your account is set up, follow in-app instructions to unlock a bike. Scan the QR code on the bike itself or input the bike ID number also located on the bike. Once your bike is unlocked, enjoy your ride. When finished with your ride, bring the bike to one of the four Marshfield locations, and follow the instructions on how to end your ride with the app and lock your bike back up. You will get a referral code after you finish your ride, and you can share it with others to earn free rides for the future.



It was presented to the citizens of Wisconsin to be used for wildlife conservation for all time. Mead's diverse habitats harbor an abundance of wildlife: 270 documented species of birds, a variety of North American mammals, as well as reptiles, amphibians, and insects. Such diversity ensures that with each visit there is something new to discover. Offering over 80 miles of hiking trails, bike trails, and recreational opportunities, Mead can truly offer visitors a one-onone nature experience.

Located 13 miles south of downtown Marshfield, via Highway 73 and 80, on County Road A. The 172-acre park is situated on the banks of the Yellow River. Two small artificial lakes created by dams on the river and a small pine-wooded island provide scenic beauty for the entire area. One of the main attractions of the park is the 225 foot suspension bridge over the river. Other attractions include a disc golf course, stone shelter, and beach area. 

WILDWOOD CONNECTOR TRAIL (1)

The Wildwood Connector Trail (seen in yellow on the map to the right) is the most recent addition to Marshfield's impressive biking and walking trail system. The 2.5 mile long asphalt trail, located between 17th Street and McMillan, is both GALVIN AVENUE TRAIL 5 on-road and off-road.

MCMILLAN MARSH WILDLIFE AREA **2**

715-457-6771 o meadwildlife.org McMillan Marsh Wildlife Area is a diverse landscape of wetlands, woodlands, and grasslands. The area is approximately 6,500 acres in size and is located one mile north of the city limits of Marshfield. The property is open to hunting and trapping during the regular seasons, except for designated refuge areas. A seasonal 6.25 mile bicycle trail (combination of lime and gravel) is open May 1-September 1.

MILL CREEK TRAIL 3

Located on the south side of Marshfield in the Mill Creek Business Park. Preferred access to the trail is at 29th Street and Apple Avenue, but you can also access the business park from Cherry Avenue, Commerce Drive, and Hwy 10. The trail is 10' wide asphalt surface, and is approximately 2.6 miles long.

HAMUS NATURE PRESERVE TRAIL 4

Located at 210 Wilderness View Drive, it includes one mile of asphalt trails and over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails, with a small pond in the area.

A 10' wide, one-mile asphalt trail between Becker Road and 4th Street. On-road bike lane from Becker Road to McMillan Street.

GRIESE PARK TRAIL 6


Located at Griese Park, 1001 E. 29th Street, the trail is 3/4-mile long, 8' wide, asphalt surface.

UW ARBORETUM CONNECTOR TRAIL 7

Located at the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and 11th Street near Washington Elementary School, this trail connects to the UW Arboretum Trail.

WEBER PARK TRAIL 8

This 37-acre city park can be accessed at the corner of Holly Avenue and the end of West 5th Street. It includes an asphalt trail between 5th Street and Adler Road, plus over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails. The park has a parking lot and a small nature pond.



City of Marshfield Opens Streets to UTV/ATV Trend

UTV and ATV trail riding continues to be one of the hottest outdoor trends and doesn't show signs of slowing. Research has shown that towns and cities that cater to the trend reap economic benefits. With this in mind, the City of Marshfield has jumped on the bandwagon to piggyback on what neighboring communities have started.

WHAT'S NEW: In April, the City of Marshfield opened select streets to ATV/UTV use demonstrating their support for the vision that routes bring dollars to local businesses.

"The economic impact of making a town rider-friendly is huge, and we've seen it work in other similar municipalities," says Mandy Witt, co-owner, Power Pac. "A major benefit of the Marshfield is that they connect to mainline routes from outside the area. This gives local businesses the opportunity to access an untapped resource for profit – profit that will stay and be spent in this area. It's a big step in the right direction for economic development and we applaud the city and Tom Turchi for seeing the vision." These new routes follow on the heels of a few very productive years for making Wood County rider-friendly:

• In early 2022, Wood County opened a majority of county highways to UTV and ATV use (unless a township objected or traffic levels prohibited it).

• In 2019, nearly 75 miles of new UTV/ATV routes were opened in addition to new ATV/ UTV campsites in Pittsville's Dexter Park.

• More than \$400,000 in grants that funded route and trail maintenance was also awarded to the county.

• In addition to these efforts, Mandy and Josh Witt, owners of Power Pac, worked with local townships to open additional routes in the towns of Lincoln and Cameron and donated the road signs for these routes.

"The new routes demonstrate Wood County's commitment to growing offroad tourism," says Jake Hahn, Chairman, Highway, Infrastructure and Recreation Committee. "Neighboring counties are generating a lot of tourism with ATV/UTV routes. Jackson County generates \$12 million dollars of economic activity with their route and trail system. That's the kind of shot in the arm that will allow local bars and restaurants to keep their doors open. We can't afford not to do it."

A new study from the Wood County Planning and Zoning Department estimated the economic impact of county UTV/ATV trails and routes to be around \$1500 per visiting rider," says Matt McLean, Director, Marshfield Convention & Visitors Bureau. "Not only are these developments a great asset for riders, but they will invigorate local businesses by increasing traffic from an undertapped group of visitors and consumers."

WILDWOOD PARK & ZOO

Wildwood Park & Zoo has been a beloved destination for generations of residents and visitors alike. This picturesque area has a rich history dating back to the early 20th century. With its scenic beauty, diverse wildlife, and community involvement, Wildwood Park & Zoo has become an integral part of Marshfield's cultural heritage.

The land that the Wildwood Park & Zoo now occupies was originally dense woods and logged by the workers for prominent local brothers, Charles M. and William H. Upham. The Wildwood Connecter Trail running north from the park through the heart of town marks the original path of the railroad tracks that the brother had placed to transport wood from the forest to the mill at the center of town. William eventually decided to establish a power plant and water works station in the area of the to-be Wildwood Park which was attained by the city in 1904, along with 120 acres of surrounding land.

About the time of the city's purchase of the power plant, several utility workers befriended and started to care for two black bears. But by 1910, due to public concerns regarding the welfare of the bears, care was transferred to Mayor Robert Connor who built an encloser for the bears.

Meanwhile Upham Woods continued to see development when the Eagles Club took out a 10-year lease from the city to create walkways and build benches. Eventually the Eagles Club also built the 60-by-120-foot pavilion designed to be used as a dance hall and auditorium. Interest in the park grew with the Women's Club who suggest the name "Wildwood Park" in 1923.

The mayor's bears took up permanent residence at the park in 1928 along with two racoons and in 1929 the city began development for an official zoo. The city acquired two deer in 1930 and at the same time the manager of J.C. Penney, F.M. Follendorf, started obtaining a variety of birds including Mongolian pheasants,




white king pigeons, and peafowl to be later housed at the zoo. By July 27, 1930, the zoo was officially dedicated by the city of Marshfield.


Wildwood Park & Zoo's success has always been intertwined with the support of the Marshfield community with a variety of animals over the years including many from around the world such as zebras and gibbons. Volunteers and local organizations played a crucial role in its development and maintenance over the years and in the 1970s, the Wildwood Zoological Society was formed to support the zoo financially and promote its educational mission.

Wildwood Park & Zoo has always been committed to education. Over the years, it has introduced various educational programs, including school tours, workshops, and wildlife conservation initiatives. Even including Sensory Gardens which include a wide verity of flowering and non-flowering plants designed to encourage visitors to experience the senses of sight, sound, smell, and touch. The zoo's dedicated staff and volunteers work tirelessly to provide informative and engaging experiences for visitors of all ages.

In the fall of 2019, the Welcome Center was opened with features that include an interactive water table and electricity model and additional exhibits including snakes, lizards, turtles, salamanders, and honeybees. In addition to the Welcome Center, the Zoo has seen many recent updates from a new, larger, exhibit for the two cougars acquired in 2008, an expansion of the bear exhibit including an enclosed walkway arching over the visitor walking path to house Kodiak bears acquired in 2015, and the remodel of the old cougar exhibit into a new exhibit for the foxes.

As we celebrate its storied history, we recognize that Wildwood Park & Zoo is not just a destination but a living testament to the power of community, education, and the enduring love for the natural world. It stands as a testament to the beauty of the wild, right in the heart of Marshfield, Wisconsin.
