If you visit us, please visit our neighbors too in Wausau, Stevens Point and Wisconsin Rapids and experience all Central Wisconsin has to offer.



#### **LOST IN THE CLOUDS**

Marshfield is excited to host two large events this July 11th & 12th, 2025: the Parish Pull and the Dairyland Balloon Jubilee. These festivals not only showcase the town's agricultural roots and community bonds but also attract visitors from all over, eager to partake in the festivities.



The Parish Pull is an annual tractor pull event organized by St. John's Catholic Church taking place Friday evening July 11th at Marshfield Fairgrounds Park. This event brings together local farmers and machinery enthusiasts to showcase their strengths and skills. Participants from across the region compete in various categories, from antique tractors to modern high-horsepower machines, pulling heavy weights along a defined track.

The atmosphere is electric, filled with the roar of engines, the cheers of spectators, and the smell of fresh popcorn from nearby vendors. Families often gather for a day of fun, enjoying not just the competition but also live music, local food stalls, and community camaraderie.

Join us for the inaugural year of the Dairyland Balloon Jubilee taking to the skies Friday, July 11th and Saturday, July 12th in the evenings. It will transform the skies above the beautiful Seehafer Acres Farm near Marshfield into a colorful canvas of hot air balloons. This event features 30+ balloonists who come to showcase their stunning craft against the serene backdrop of the Wisconsin sky in the heart of dairyland.

The Jubilee kicks off with balloon launches in the early morning, offering breathtaking views as the balloons take to the air, showcasing an array of vibrant colors and designs. Attendees can participate in tethered balloon rides, providing a unique perspective of the festival and the surrounding landscapes.

In addition to the balloon launches, the Dairyland Balloon Jubilee features a variety of entertainment options, including live music, food vendors, arts and crafts booths, and activities for children. Evening events often culminate in a spectacular musical balloon glow with everybody's favorite DJ, Dave Kallaway, where the balloons are illuminated in the dark, creating a magical atmosphere synced to fun music.

#### **DOWN TO EARTH**

Both the Parish Pull and the Dairyland Balloon Jubilee exemplify the strong sense of community in Marshfield. They not only highlight the town's agricultural heritage but also bring people together to celebrate quintessential Wisconsin fun. #### MARSHFIELD DAIRYFEST

Friday, May 30th will kick off with the Mayor's breakfast at the Central Wisconsin Fairgrounds. We will be serving pancakes, special scrambled eggs, fresh cheese curds, with hot coffee, ice cold white or chocolate milk, and much more. The first 1,000 people will get to take home a commemorative, ceramic coffee mug. Friday evening is Picnic in the Park, at Columbia Park with entertainment for the entire family, inflatable fun for the kids, games and food trucks or pack your own picnic lunch. The Marshfield Civic Band will also

perform. Fun begins at 5 p.m. The Hub City Concert Series Kickoff takes place at Wenzel Plaza starting at 7 p.m.

Saturday, May 31st is Dairyfest Parade Day. The parade steps off at Second and Central at 11 a.m. and ends at the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds. After the parade, head to Wenzel Plaza where Center City Fun Days will be taking place. Fun for the entire family and food trucks galore. There will be a pie and ice cream social at the Upham House and a craft show along West Third Street. In the evening head over to the outdoor beer garden at Nutz Deep II from 3 p.m. to 11 p.m.

There will also be a softball tournament all weekend long at the Central Wisconsin Fairgrounds.



The Central Wisconsin Holstein Breeders Association, along with the support of the Wisconsin State Fair Association, Wood County, Wood County Bankers Association, and citizens of Marshfield, banded together to bring to the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds a landmark building to provide a space for the Breeders Association sales and as a show barn and arena during the Fair which it is still used for to this day.


Designed by W.W. Clark, the Barn's round structure allows for an efficient arrangement of stanchions allowing it to house 250 head of cattle while also making it more wind-resistant and assisting in staying cooler in the summer. Additionally, the walls are stronger from the lineal, not cross grain strength of the lumber, making it 20 times stronger.

Construction of the Barn was started on Thanksgiving on 1915 with excavation work done with the use of a horse-drawn slusher. The framework was done during the winter and the floors and stanchions were completed in the spring of 1916. The main floor of the barn held two rings of stalls with a large show and sales arena in the middle which was circled by wooden bleachers able to seat 1,000 people.

At the time of its construction, the Barn also boasted a new automatic manure cleaner composed of a cable suspended from the rafters that held a bucket. The bucket was pushed about the barn as needed and then moved to another track which took it outside to be emptied. Unfortunately, the system did not work well and was removed. In 1917, a second floor to the barn was completed and used to show chickens and rabbits. It also had a bandstand which made the second floor a popular location for barn dances though eventually it was deemed unsafe for such events and is now only used for storage.

The Round Barn stands as a welcoming tradition to Central Wisconsin State Fair goers with updates and reconditioning over the years to preserve this over 100-year-old building. In March of 1997, the Central Wisconsin State Fair Round Barn was added to the State and National Historic Places and has been noted as the "World's Largest Round Barn" which remains uncontested.

Don't forget to stop by this landmark during your visit. Call the Central Wisconsin State Fairgrounds Office at 715-387-1261 to organize a tour today; admittance is available at \$1 per person. Of course, the best time to see the Round Barn is during the Central Wisconsin State Fair, August 19-24, 2025, when it is in full use for it's intended purpose.

#### Ride On Marshfield Community Bikeshare

The Marshfield Community Bikeshare has been reimagined with help from Wood County and many partners. Starting out as a free bike check out program at local hotels, it has expanded to four community locations featuring 20 cruiser-style bikes that can be checked out via app for a rate of \$1/hour at four different locations throughout Marshfield (make sure to bring your helmet!).

This new expansion was modeled after the River Riders Bike Share program, which originally began in Wisconsin Rapids in 2014. It was created with the goal to bring additional transportation and recreation options to all of Wood County. Thanks to local community support and sponsors, this program continues to achieve that goal by growing into the city of Marshfield.

#### How to Use The Bikeshare:


The bike share program is an app-based program. Start by downloading the Koloni App (available on Android and Apple stores). It is free to download and sign-up. Create your own user account by following in-app instructions.

Once your account is set up, follow in-app instructions to unlock a bike. Scan the QR code on the bike itself or input the bike ID number also located on the bike. Once your bike is unlocked, enjoy your ride.

When finished with your ride, bring the bike to one of the four Marshfield locations, and follow the instructions on how to end your ride with the app and lock your bike back up. You will get a referral code after you finish your ride, and you can share it with others to earn free rides for the future.





#### South Wood County Park

Located on the banks of Lake Wazeecha, South Wood County Park is a beloved destination for both locals and tourists. One of its highlights are the beautiful beach areas, the White Sand and Red Sand Beaches both great for a swim or paddle. # HAPPY TRAILS

#### WILDWOOD CONNECTOR TRAIL 1

The Wildwood Connector Trail (seen in yellow on the map to the right) is the most recent addition to Marshfield's impressive biking and walking trail system. The 2.5 mile long asphalt trail, located between 17th Street and McMillan, is both on-road and off-road.

#### **MCMILLAN MARSH** WILDLIFE AREA (2)

715-457-6771 o meadwildlife.org McMillan Marsh Wildlife Area is a diverse landscape of wetlands, woodlands, and grasslands. The area is approximately 6,500 acres in size and is located one mile north of the city limits of Marshfield. The property is open to hunting and trapping during the regular seasons, except for designated refuge areas. A seasonal 6.25 mile bicycle trail (combination of lime and gravel) is open May 1-September 1.

#### MILL CREEK TRAIL 3

Located on the south side of Marshfield in the Mill Creek Business Park. Preferred access to the trail is at 29th Street and Apple Avenue, but you can also access the business park from Cherry Avenue, Commerce Drive, and Hwy 10. The trail is 10' wide asphalt surface, and is approximately 2.6 miles long.

#### HAMUS NATURE PRESERVE TRAIL 4

Located at 210 Wilderness View Drive, it includes one mile of asphalt trails and over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails, with a small pond in the area.

#### **GALVIN AVENUE TRAIL 5**

A 10' wide, one-mile asphalt trail between Becker Road and 4th Street. On-road bike lane from Becker Road to McMillan Street.

#### **GRIESE PARK TRAIL 6**


Located at Griese Park, 1001 E. 29th Street, the trail is 3/4-mile long, 8' wide, asphalt surface.

#### **UW ARBORETUM** CONNECTOR TRAIL 7

Located at the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and 11th Street near Washington Elementary School, this trail connects to the UW Arboretum Trail.

#### WEBER PARK TRAIL 8

This 37-acre city park can be accessed at the corner of Holly Avenue and the end of West 5th Street. It includes an asphalt trail between 5th Street and Adler Road, plus over 1.5 miles of natural surface trails. The park has a parking lot and a small nature pond.



#### MAPLE FALL FEST

Celebrate the start of fall in Marshfield and its crisp autumn days at our city's own Maple Fall Fest. This year the festival takes over Wildwood Park & Zoo on September 13 & 14, 2025—keeping with a 33-year tradition. Families start the day with a hearty potato pancake breakfast served by Columbus Catholic School Athletics. They fill up on flapjacks topped with melted butter, locally produced maple syrup, with sides including maple sausages, and, of course, cheese curds. Maple Fall Fest draws visitors and families out in droves, with approximately 15,000 attendees between Saturday and Sunday.


Marshfield Maple Fall Fest has become known as the place to find some of the best original, handmade craft items and artwork in the Midwest. With over 150 vendors, you'll delight in finding that distinctive, one-of-kind gift for yourself or someone special. Shoppers can also

peruse Amish booths selling spectacular mums and hearty baked goods, along with other specialty foods with mouth-watering maple flavors. You can eat your way around the fest at the centrally located food court featuring favorite local food trucks and more; enjoy a cold brew in the Beer Garden located amidst the food court. Amuse the kids with crafts and activities such as gourd bowling provided by Discovery Education Station and the Chestnut Center for the Arts before roaming the inflatables and trampolines of the Kids' Zone. Throughout the weekend, in addition to checking out the nearby Wildwood Zoo, spectators can gather to watch performances by Mad Dog & Merrill Grillin' Buddies, local dance organizations, and actors' group, and the release of monarch butterflies.

Starting in 2019, the educational demonstration of the release of monarch butterflies by the Marshfield Monarchs has been a big hit on the main stage. The


presentation includes learning about the life cycle of the butterfly and information about the special project of the Marshfield Monarchs taken on by the Gwiazda family. The family began raising monarch butterflies to help increase the dwindling population in 2016; only one out of every 10-20 caterpillars becomes a monarch butterfly. The group released 200 butterflies as the crowd watched on in awe. Marshfield Monarchs reported they released over 2,200 butterflies over the summer of 2024! Maple Fall Fest marked the start of the butterflies' migration from Wildwood Zoo as they began a long journey south to Mexico for the winter.


Truly, Maple Fall Fest has become a celebration of giving—we thank our community members who give of their time and of themselves by thinking of the joy it brings others.



# Unearth Whimsy on the Downtown Jurustic Trail

Thousands of visitors come to experience the whimsy of Jurustic Park each year. This amazing, metal sculpture park, located

just north of Marshfield, is surrounded by a mystical forested area, and even has an enchanting Hobbit House. But what many people don't know is that some of the artist Clyde Wynia's creatures have escaped and have hidden in Downtown Marshfield. To help you find these zany creatures and discover some of Marshfield's hidden gems for dining and

shopping, we have created the Downtown Jurustic Creature Trail.

\*This tour clocks in at just under 1.5 miles. Most people walking at a leisurely pace will take about 30-45 minutes to complete it (but we encourage you to stop and enjoy the sculptures, shopping opportunities, delicious dining options, and fun attractions along the way!)

1. Kick off your adventure at home base: the Marshfield Area Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MACCI) & Visit Marshfield office building. This is a great place to grab a copy of the official Marshfield Visitor Guide, if you don't already have one (also available at visitmarshfield.com/visitor-guide), and to enjoy ample parking and a variety of great restaurants nearby if you'd like to fuel up

before hitting the Downtown Jurustic Creature Trail. It's here that you'll meet Tillie, the first creature who, very slowly and steadily, made a new home amongst the rusty reeds.

2. Take the trail north on Central Avenue, dubbed "Main Street" by the locals before detouring a block over to Chestnut Avenue. Nestled near the towering structure of the Chestnut Center for the Arts are two more creatures, who like to say "whooo," "mew," and play a tune or two on a stringed

instrument. While you're here, check out the Chestnut's offerings, including calendar of events, pottery studio, art class schedule, or art exhibitions displayed in their gallery.

3. Delightful detour: follow the trail back to Central Avenue by way of the Wenzel Family Plaza. Depending on the time of day

> at the plaza, you're likely to see children running through their water feature, morning people stretching on yoga mats, a food truck feeding folk during the afternoon lunch rush, or live concerts and other entertaining happening weekends. If you're looking to satisfy your sweet tooth before moving on, stop in at the downtown location of Hub City

Ice Cream or at the 21/2 Cups Cupcakery & Bake Shop. At the spot marked #3 on your map, you'll find a towering, metal turtle.

4. Continue along the paved walking/ biking trail on East Veteran's Parkway. You will pass by the Everett Roehl Marshfield Public Library and the Marshfield Veterans Memorial, showcasing paintings by local artists and a flag display, honoring heroes from the Marshfield area. Look up to see the largest, fire-breathing, winged creature on the tour trail (this fantastical fellow flew in to guard our fair city and hasn't left since!). Snap a selfie with this scaly friend (#marshfieldmadenew), turn around, and head back to Central Avenue, where you'll pass the Royal Tokyo Restaurant, housed in a historic train depot, and is a known as



a popular dinner spot for Teppanyaki style group meals and the place to go for family celebrations.




5. Turn down Central Avenue for more popular restaurants and shopping options, and make your way down to your next destination, Hardacre Park. Named after an influential mayor known for her leadership, you'll find rusty creatures that swam to Marshfield during a great flood, probably thousands of years ago. You can also pull up a bench and view a painted timeline of Marshfield's pasts and milestones in the surrounding murals. Next-door is a staple of Marshfield, Crabby's Lounge, known to have one of the best brandy old fashions in town.

6. Meander down a few more short blocks to Nutz Deep II, one of Marshfield's most popular restaurants and watering holes (with a wacky name and seriously good burgers). The creatures here are some of the newest that just escaped Jurustic Park. Be careful - they may not be as used to close human interaction as some of the other creatures on

7. Cross Central Avenue to find your final stop, the Blue Heron Brewpub, another great place to grab lunch or dinner. You'll love the modern, gastropub atmosphere in this former ice cream factory building. After finding all the creatures in the Heron, kick back and relax (maybe while enjoying a pint), and you'll find yourself back at the start of your journey.

Be a good anthropologist and report your findings on the downtown trail back to us, so that creator Clyde from Jurustic Park can help track down these rusty creatures and try to return them to his park!




